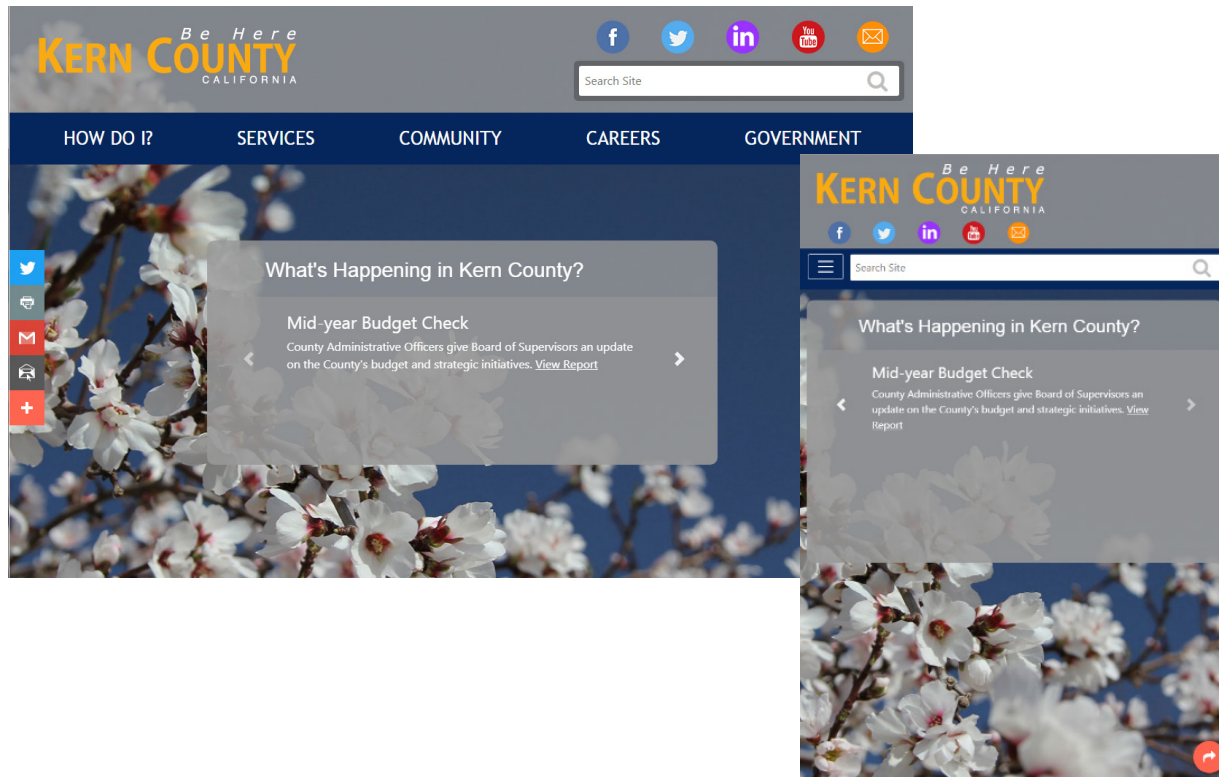


Guide to Using the New Kern County Homepage

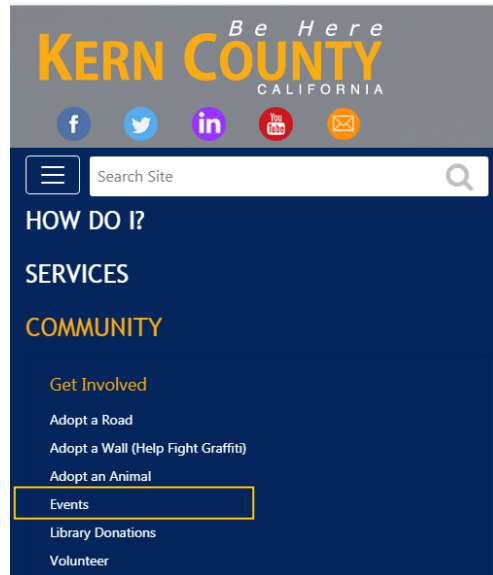
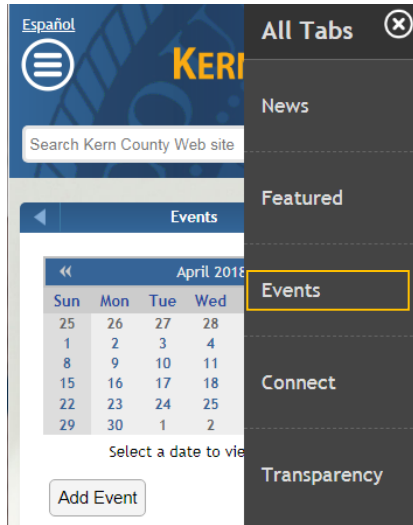
Note: in the mobile design, the main menu looks like this:

Previous Location:

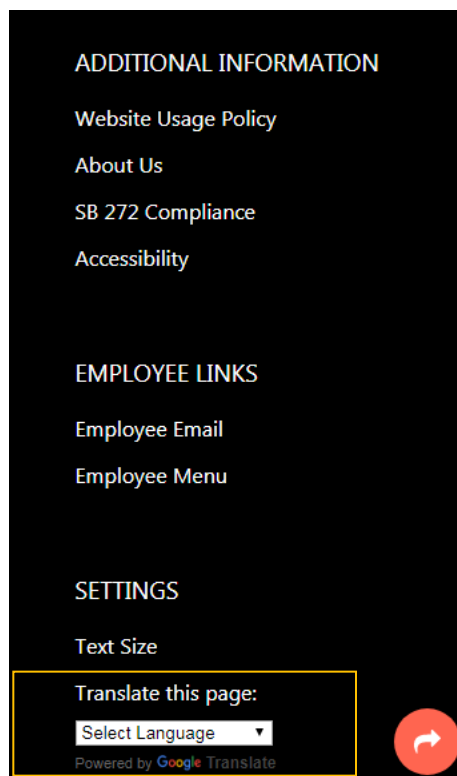
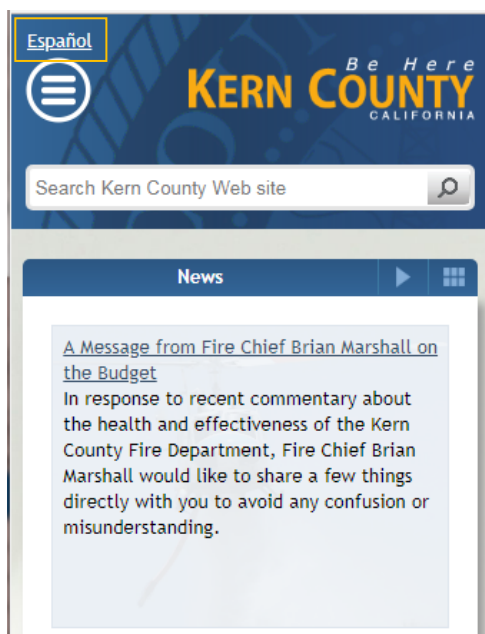
In the new mobile design, Events have moved up to the top of the page. (Select Community from the mobile menu to locate the Events link)

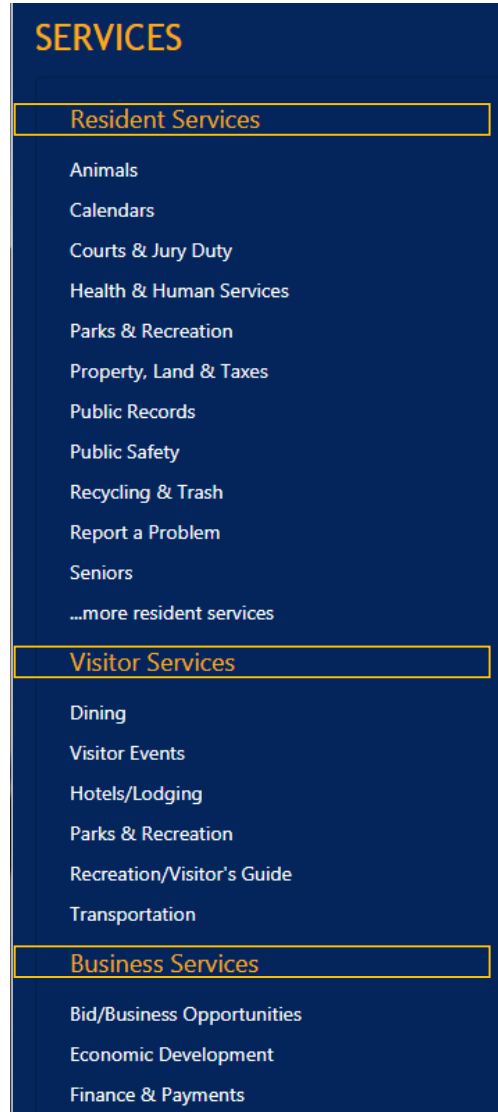
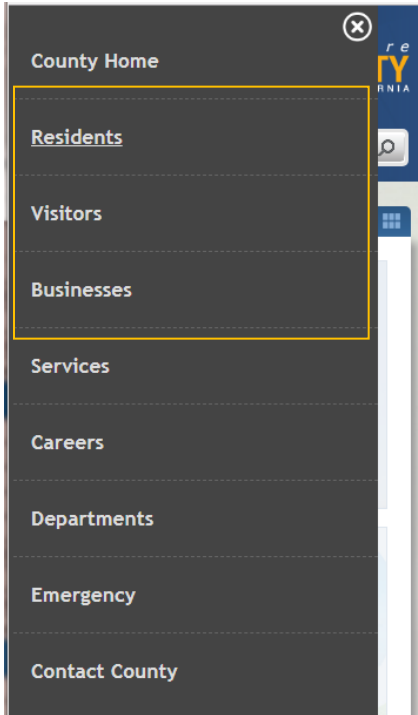
In the new mobile design, our viewers can choose from a large variety of languages. This new translate feature is located in the footer, under SETTINGS

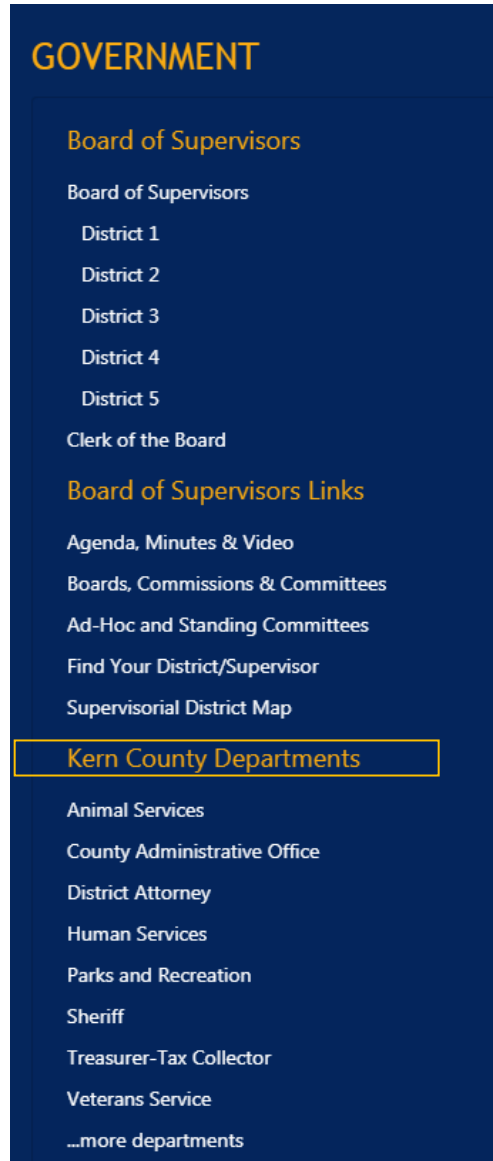
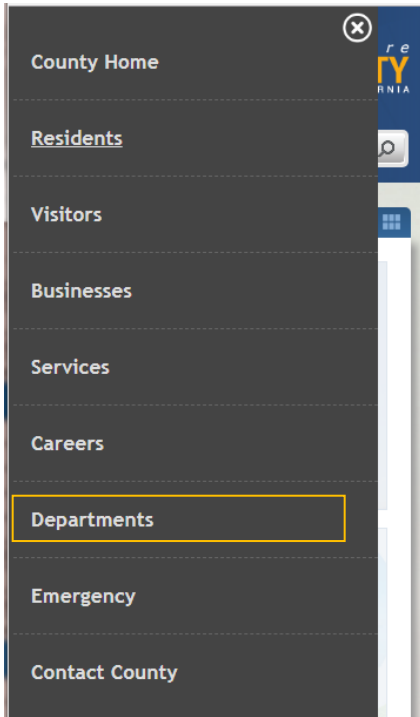
These three menus are still located at the top of the page in our new mobile design. (Select Services from the mobile menu to locate the Residents, Visitors and Business links)

Previous Location

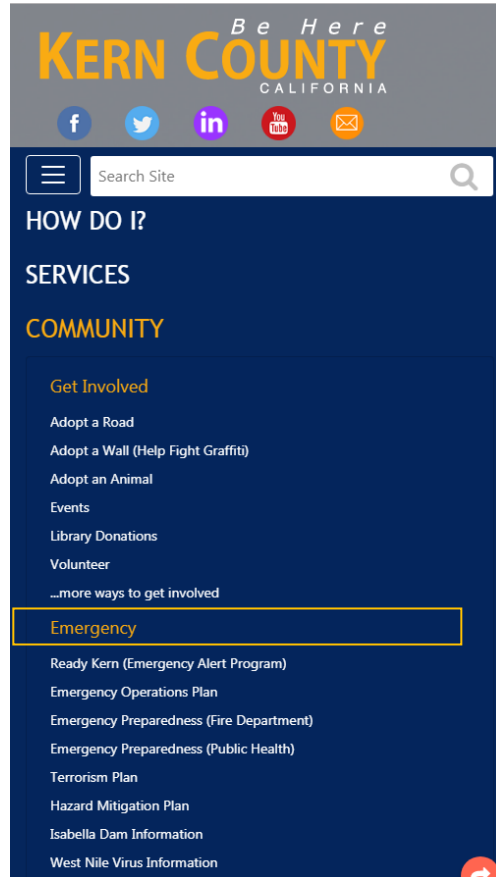
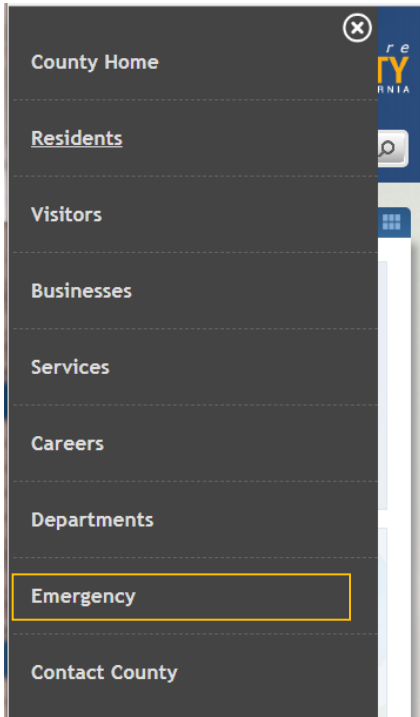
Departments are still located at the top of the page in the new design. (Select Government from the mobile menu to locate the Departments link)

Emergency is still located at the top of the page in our new design. (Select Community from the mobile menu to locate the Emergency link)






